Headquartered in Regina or Weyburn and reporting to a senior Agrologist, you will provide routine agronomic and environmental information and support to both internal and external partners. Work will focus on activities related to the evaluation, analysis and extension on ecological function, watershed health, non-point source pollution and/or habitat conservation.

Duties and responsibilities may include the following:

- Provide technical advice and information to agricultural producers, NGO's, other governmental agencies, community groups, universities and schools, wildlife groups, and watershed groups;
- Undertake and assist in investigations including mapping and the collection and analysis of ecological health assessments, soil and vegetation data;
- Assist in data collection, testing, analysis and monitoring activities with clients regarding ecologically sustainable rangeland management, livestock management and production, tame forage management, cropping practices, habitat management, and vegetation, soil and water use;
- Assist in developing educational material regarding accepted ecologically sustainable agronomic practices;
- Prepare and present technical reports, assist in developing land-use management plans, and communicate results with clients and management;
- Undertake other related agronomic activities as required.

An employee in this position will spend a majority of time in a field environment with regular absences from headquarters including overnight stays.

Applicants must possess a Diploma or Degree in Agriculture or a related discipline, eligibility for certification as an Agricultural Technologist (AT) with the Saskatchewan Institute of Agrologists or membership as an Articling Agrologist (AAg) with the Saskatchewan Institute of Agrologists, and a valid driver's license. Applicants should have the ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with staff, external agencies and the public and should have knowledge and application of agronomic principles and practices.
